

We implemented a number of great initiatives and plan to work on even more in the coming year. As we work toward these goals we hope to hear from you, our community!




2016 BY THE NUMBERS

445,026 physical items circulated
55,429 digital items were checked out
25,424 library card holders
1,362 programs were offered
10,856 people attended library programs
198,010 website and online catalogue visits
Over 14,000 Internet sessions on library computers

County of Bruce 88%


Ministry of Tourism & Culture 6%

2016 HIGHLIGHTS

In 2014 when we were preparing our strategic plan, we held a number of community consultations to hear what people wanted from their local library. We want to let you know what we have accomplished so far.

You asked for:

Free online courses

We Introduced Lynda.com - a leading online learning platform that helps anyone learn business, software, technology and creative skills to achieve personal and professional goals.





A rotating cultural space

We celebrated 2016 Culture Days with the creation of a community canvas where members of the public created a collaborative painting in their local branch.

Museum summer students provided an outreach program for children in a number of branches based on their Chagall exhibit.

Walkerton, Chelsey, and Wiarton Branches feature an art space that showcases local artists. This is ongoing and rotates regularly. The Walkerton branch held its annual juried art show in partnership with the Municipality of Brockton and the Brockton Art Committee.

Authors for both adults and children toured the area and visited branches throughout the year.

Branches celebrate National Canadian Film Day in April by showing Canadian Films where possible.

A space focused on community building

On May 19, 2016 we held a Newcomer Night at the Port Elgin branch to provide community information to people new to the area. Groups involved: Municipality of Saugeen Shores, Chamber of Commerce, County departments (Social Services, Museum, Tourism), 211 Grey Bruce, Georgian College, Adult Learning Centre, Lake Huron Learning, Contact North, Police Services, Chantry Centre, Rotary Club, Public Health, VPI Employment Services



WHAT WE'RE WORKING ON

Becoming a hub for community groups and linking groups across Bruce County, hosting creative events for people of all ages to connect

2017 has three Community Info Expos planned that will bring together community groups and services in one convenient place to share info and ideas.

In 2017 we will host a "maker" event linking many creative groups in the community and giving them a venue to show the public what they make.

We will look for more opportunities to link community groups across the county. We will plan to offer creative events for people of all ages.

Change the way patrons access the library:

In 2017 we have committed to phase 1 of a bookmobile project with the hope of providing the service throughout the county in the coming years.

We provide a virtual library through our online book and audiobook collections, various learning databases, various links to community information and children's educational games. We are always looking for ways to expand what we currently offer. This is assessed annually.

Library hours are assessed annually during the budgeting process. When an opportunity for a change to branch hours presents itself we do make small changes.

Where possible we have added more lounge space in branches (e.g. Lion's Head in October 2016) and more space for patrons to use their own devices (e.g. Port Elgin). We keep this in mind whenever there is an opportunity to change the way we use space in a branch.

The mobile circulation app is used at outreach events in the community to register members for cards and to check out items without having to visit a branch.
