The mission of our County's library system is to provide all the information, knowledge and entertainment resources you need to achieve your goals, foster your interests, and realize your dreams. In 2019, the Board and staff of the BCPL made significant steps toward achieving that mission.

This year we expanded our collections, successfully offered new programs and took steps to enhance access to books and other materials across the library system.

The addition of ukuleles to our collection, with the help of the Eva Leflar Foundation, was of particular note as were the new sensory kits and Be Active Sports Kits which were added with the support of the Community Foundation Grey Bruce and Grey Bruce Public Health respectively.

This year's 'Mini Comic-Con' event was the Library's most successful event ever and proved to be an outstanding community building event. The Business Perks program, which encouraged residents to shop local and get a library card, helped build partnerships between the Library and the local business community to the benefit of all.

The elimination of internet fees helped to enhance access to library services as did the introduction of the 'Book Club Kits' that enabled book clubs to easily borrow multiple copies of a single title.

The BCPL continues to believe strongly in a future where innovative ideas can fundamentally change the way our communities learn, play, and connect with each other. The new and innovative ideas that have been implemented by the dedicated staff of the BCPL in 2019 have continued to advance this vision.

The Board and I look forward to building on our 2019 successes in the years to come and, as always, we encourage everyone to join the library and visit often to enjoy and explore.



Highlights



As part of our plan to launch a Bookmobile we created a survey to assess the wants and needs of our patrons for such a service. A Bookmobile will allow us to bring library resources to our communities and provide services to people who have difficulty visiting one of our library branches. Book bags were also sold in our branches to raise funds for our Bookmobile.



In 2019 we had a total of 26,447 people attend 2,811 free programs throughout our 17 branches. In addition to our weekly programs such as Story Time, Baby Time, Kids Create, book clubs, and Needle Arts, we also hosted author visits, a National Canadian Film Day celebration, a guest speaker series, a juried art show, Let's Talk Science shows, and more!

In 2019 we launched our mobile app. This innovative platform allows our patrons to manage their account, browse the catalogue, discover their nearest branch, explore upcoming programs and events, download eBooks, eAudiobooks, and music.

This app available for free via Google Play or the Apple App Store.



In 2019 we enhanced our collections with a variety of new items available both for checkout and for programming use.

Some highlights include a green screen for adding custom backgrounds to pictures & movies, coding tools for children of all ages, a variety of STEM kits that include Ozobots, Snap Circuits, ukuleles, snowshoes, sensory kits, and several Be Active kits.
